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
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Theory of change for UNICEF partners and civil society organizations on adolescent empowerment framework in addressing gender based violence and exploitation.

Adolescent boys and girls have the knowledge, skills, and peer group support to make their community safer for girls, and to act to protect themselves from violence, exploitation, and child marriage

Parents and community members support adolescents in seeking information and accessing services, encouraging decision making and playing key role in creating a protective and supportive environment.

Relevant government service providers in the target communities implement and enforce laws, policies, schemes, and programmes for adolescents to prevent violence and exploitation.

OUTPUTS

Increased knowledge of adolescents on gender and life skills, through classes, games, club activities, and campaigns.

Increased safer spaces created where adolescents can meet and discuss issues.

Increased opportunities created for adolescents to transition to secondary education, practice decision making, assertive communication, negotiation and conflict resolution to address violence, exploitation, and abuse.

Adolescents are exposed to rights-based platforms like Adolescents Clubs to build confidence to promote inter-gender and inter-generational dialogue on violence, exploitation, and abuse.

Communities and parents support access to secondary education.

Increased knowledge of families, communities and decision makers on gender based violence and adolescent intervention.

Increased access to services to prevent violence, exploitation and abuse.

Increased knowledge and skills to set up a Youth Club for adolescents.

Increased safer spaces created for families, communities, and decision makers to support adolescents.

Increased number of duty bearers from village, block, and district levels are mobilised and trained.

Enhanced knowledge and skills of duty bearers to render support for preventing violence, child marriage among adolescents.

Increased involvement of duty bearers to promote access and delivery of services for adolescent effectively.

Increased involvement of duty bearers to support adolescent enrolment and transition to secondary education.


Inputs and Activities
