






UNDERSTANDING OF THE NOVEL CORONA VIRUS

You might have heard the word "Corona" from your parents, school teachers, friends or even through television or social media.






Oh My God! But hold on. What does that mean?

Various people from around the world have fallen sick to this disease.


FACT CHECK!

- CORONA in Latin means "CROWN"
- Under a microscope, the virus can be seen to be crown shaped having spikes with bubbles at the end of them.



Most symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to that of COMMON FLU.

(You might have already had some of the symptoms before)




- Most people affected by the CORONA VIRUS are usually mildly ill with other diseases.
- Children are not greatly affected by the virus and even if infected, the severity of the disease is minimal.



Old people or already sick people are at more risk of catching the virus





To protect yourself, your family and friends from the virus, you can follow a few preventive measures.

1. Wash your hands often!

- Wash with soap and water
- Wash for at least 20 seconds. Singing the alphabets or happy birthday to you is helpful to do so.
- It is important to wash before and after eating, after using the bathroom and immediately after coming back home.
- Scrub gently and wash in between fingers, nails, front and back of both your hands.



2. Sneeze or cough into your elbow, handkerchief or tissue

Corona virus spreads through little droplets from lungs and

 Using hand kerchief or tissue prevents spreading of the virus to your hands, surroundings or other people.
