Inter-State Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act (1979)	Migrant workers	It lays down conditions that the contractors must pay timely the wages equal or higher than the minimum wage, provide suitable residential accommodation, prescribed medical facilities, provide protective clothing, notify accidents and casualties to specified authorities and kin. 3.	The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009	All children, including the children of migrant workers of 6-14 years age.	The RTE Act of 2009 mandates local authorities to admit migrant children to schools.
