

Sponsoring Care



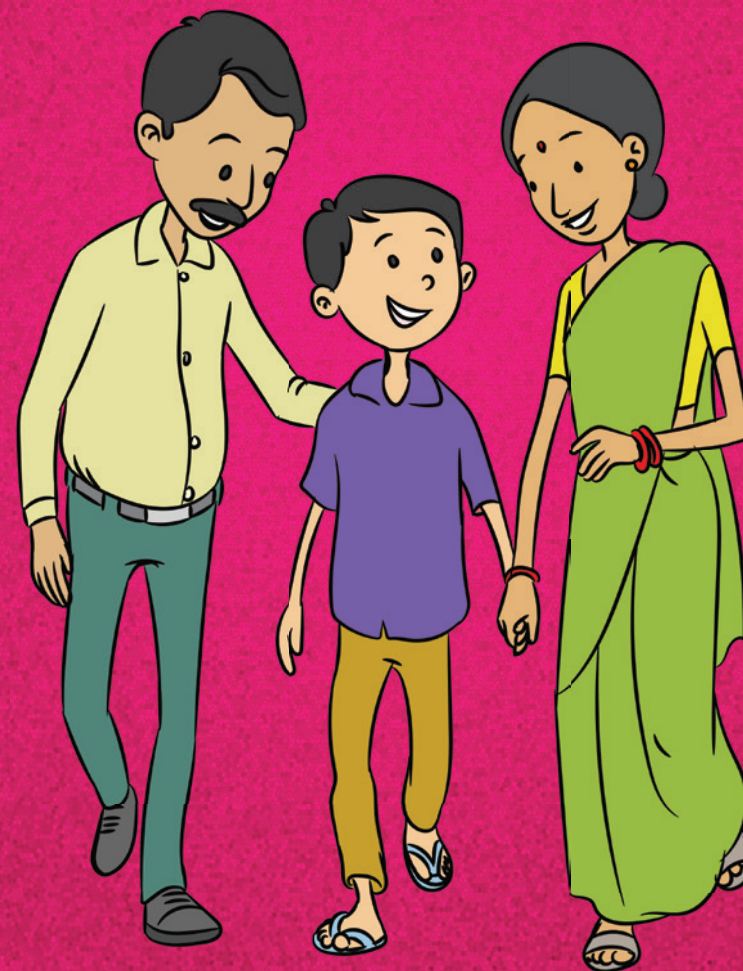
- Giving financial support for better upbringing, medical care, nutritional and educational needs so that the quality of living of the child can be improved.
- It is meant to improve lives and make those children self-sufficient who had dropped out of school and started working owing to shortage of funds.

Financial parameters:

- Each family can get a maximum of Rs 1000 each for at the most two children.
- As per the ICPS budget, the Central and State governments' fund ratio is 75:25.
- Sponsorship can be given for maximum 3 years up to the age of 18 years.

Why home based care is important for a child rather than institutional care?

Long-term institutional care has the following fallouts for a child:



- Fear of isolation
- Lack of maternal love
- Lack of self-esteem
- Lack of trust
- Obstructed development
- Emotional loss
- Mental and physical torture
- Isolation from society
- Problems in inter-personal relations

You can also give a home, shelter and family to an orphaned child

- The Child Welfare Committee confirms that one is free to adopt any child less than six years of age.
- A child can be adopted only through specialised adoption agencies duly approved and licensed by the state government.
- Centralised Adoption Resource Agency (CARA) is the designated central agency of the Government of India and is responsible for issuing guidelines and rules related to the adoption of Indian children.
