About CPS (erstwhile ICDS)

Child Protection Scheme, erstwhile ICPS, is covered under the umbrella of Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS), Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India.

This scheme aims to create a safe and protective environment for children. It caters to children in need of care and protection (CNCP) and children living in difficult circumstances.





Objectives of CPS

CPS works on the principles of protection of rights and best interest of the child under Juvenile Justice (care and protection of children) Act, 2015 and Model Rules, 2016.

As per this scheme, children up to 18 years of age who are CNCP

and live in difficult circumstances are provided with rehabilitation and support. There are homes for children where they are provided nutrition, education, training, health services

and rehabilitation.
